eBird Enterprise Our revolutionary database and advanced analyses that channel the collection of highguality citizen-science data to help us understand bird populations at continental scales.

BirdCast A collaboration to capture bird migration in real time and generate forecasts to inform conservation and civil-planning decisions.

Birds of the World The most robust ornithological resource ever created, combining four renowned ornithology resources, the work of nearly 2,000 authors, and the vast archives of eBird and the Macaulay Library.

Merlin Bird ID An app for birders of all skill levels to identify and keep track of sightings and songs in the field.
